The belief that, if allowed to develop openly in a prepared environment, tiny humans already possess the psychic capabilities to absorb and learn exactly what they need in any given moment.

"How does he achieve this independence? He does it by means of a continuous activity. How does he become free? By means of constant effort. ...we know that development results from activity. The environment must be rich in motives which lend interest to activity and invite the child to conduct his own experiences." (The Absorbent Mind)

"These children reveal to us the most vital need of their development, saying: 'Help me to do it alone!'" (The Discovery of the Child)

It's not just WHAT we say but HOW we say it (Issue 2/February)

*The most important lesson of any moment is to treat each other with kindness.

*We model communication skills that will further their quest for independence.

*By the time they are two, it's important the adults in their lives hold them responsible for respectful communication, otherwise we are withholding tools they need for further social development

Tell them what they CAN do

(Issue 3/March)

*Positive redirection and language modeling are the most effective ways to resolve the inevitable conflicts of early childhood.

*Subtle changes in the words we choose as adults can make a big difference in the level of success and understanding on the part of the child.

*When possible, give a list of at least three other options.

Freedom within limits and the value of conflict and conflict resolution

(Issue 4/April)

*The full potential of growth is possible when children feel the security of clear expectations and boundaries.

*There are three basic limits of freedom that are true throughout our lives: respect for oneself, others and the environment.

*The adult village surrounding each child should strive for consistency in interpretation and reinforcement of this balance of freedom within limits

*Each new freedom comes with attendant responsibilities.

*We offer the traditional early childhood needs of stories, music, art and free play.


*Along with Montessori inspired Practical Life and Sensorial experiences.
