# The Magnificance of Multi-Age

The benefits of multi-age classrooms are multifaceted. While many are social in nature, there are also intellectual and emotional advantages to this educational style. A particularly enlightening consideration is the more natural reality of being part of an age diverse group, as childhood is the only time humans are ever divided into arbitrary one year age groups.

Some of the more obvious benefits of multi-age classes include the leadership opportunities for the older children and the exposure of the younger students to the skills of their older classmates. The joy that both groups exhibit when learning and teaching together is evidence of a different type of learning taking place than that between adults and children.

A spirit of cooperation organically evolves amongst the varied ages and skills. The pleasure of this cooperation is a key component of empathy development. Research is increasingly conclusive that our ability to differentiate our own emotions from that of others is far from a given and must be intentionally cultivated through experience. Our older students are still very young! Their capacity to notice and appreciate the importance of helping and making allowances for their younger classmates is one of the most important lessons that we offer. We are impressed everyday by our students spontaneous, empathetic demonstrations.

A key advantage to multi-age is that the lengthened time spent with the same teachers and peers increases students' comfort in their environment and simply wastes less time than adjusting to a new group and routine after just gaining confidence after a single school year. This extended time in an established community also lends itself to a more individualized educational approach, especially in the case of early childhood, when every kind of skill can be expected to develop at different times for different individuals.

Having a minimum of 3 years in the same class allows our students plenty of time to adjust, observe, gain skills, practice those skills, then master those skills as a leader and teacher of their younger peers. The independence and competence that this provides our students is significantly stronger thanks to the diversity of ages and length of time for which our multi-age setting allows.



## SEASONAL SHIFT

We are moving into a seasonal transition and as an outdoor program, it is imperative that we all work together to guarantee your childrens' success and comfort. As the mornings begin to cool off, it is important that your child come dressed in layers (longer sleeves on top of shorter sleeves for more independent removal) as well as have appropriate shoes and jackets. Boots are ideal in the rainy, colder months. We ask that your child has a rain jacket every day because we do not always know when a storm may pass through. If you would prefer to leave a rain layer at school that is fine.
