Program Updates

We have applied for multiple government financial assistance programs, as well as grants. We have not received any external funding at this point, but are hopeful that something will come through over the next few weeks.

We have been moving forward with Friends of Pisgah Collective, which is now officially a NC tax exempt entity, approved and accepted! We have done our part to file at the federal level, and are waiting for approval. Stay tuned for summer fundraising plans! This is a really helpful, fun way for you, your friends, and family to help us rebuild and move forward!

Preparations for Returning to School

We know this time has been very unique for everyone and imagine that schedules and habits have changed. We heavily encourage everyone to begin transitioning back towards a routine in preparation for returning to school!

If you are signed up for summer session 1 and we are able to open as planned, this would mean, by May 25, adjusting school night bedtimes back so that waking up early enough to be ready for school is possible.

During these two weeks before school begins, practice getting up early and being ready to go by 8! Even practice getting dressed, packing a snack, checking backpacks, etc. Also, it will be very helpful for the children during these weeks, if you practice following a more rigorous morning schedule, along the lines of what we shared in April.

With so much extra time at home, there are many opportunities to expand your child's responsibilities around the house.

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Bedroom:

- Organizing books and toys
- Matching socks, sorting laundry
- Dusting (this is a traditional Montessori Practical Life activity, that if presented with joy on the part of the adult, is often very pleasing to children!)

Outside:

- Raking, mulching, gathering sticks
- Weeding, watering
- Beautification (tempera paint on wood, chalk drawing, picking and arranging flowers, other decorative crafts)

Shared Spaces:

- Putting their possessions away when finished
- Tidying up seating areas (stacking pillows, folding blankets)
- Sweeping, more dusting

This is just a sampling of the multitude of ways your children can be busy and helpful all around the house!
