




Welcome to Brevard or, if you live here, hello! We have things to show you, come on and let's go.



6 Ways to Be a Helper

- 1. Bring a trash bag on your hike. Carefully pick up your trash and what others have left behind. Put it in a trashcan or take it home.
- 2. Ask an adult if you all can help volunteer for a group that cares for the forest. Or maybe donate lemonade stand money to your favorite state or national park.
- 3. Find out what the forest rules and warnings are before you start your hike.



- 4. Leave nature where it is. Every plant, rock and creature is very happy in its home. Please leave it alone and just look with your eyes.
- 5. Be kind and patient on the trail. Just like you, every hiker, biker, horse and horseback rider are there to have a good time!
- 6. Teach your friends what you learned! Show them how they can also help Trashsquatch and his forest friends keep their woods beautiful.
